ALLOCATION

£40,780 is the allocation for 2016-17.

32/185 children in school are eligible for pupil premium, this is 17% of the school.

Progress for disadvantaged children is extremely high in all subjects, it is better than their non-disadvantaged peers in school and nationally. This means they are diminishing the difference in their attainment.

In Reading, disadvantaged children attained higher than their non-disadvantaged peers and non-disadvantaged children nationally. In Writing and Maths, there is a gap between disadvantaged and other children's attainment, however this is not significant. In Maths there is still a significant gap between their attainment and that of non-disadvantaged children nationally.

£34,480 is the allocation for 2017-18.

28/180 children in school are eligible for pupil premium, this is 16% of the school.
